


Fig. 25.	Fig. 20.

Exploring Aspirator, nickel-plated, glass barrel, with two trocars and canulas, in fine leather case (Fig. 113) £0 17 6






Fig. 262. Iridectomy Knives, Aseptic Metal Handles, Jaeger's




Fig. 426. Fig. 427.







Fig. 471. Cline's, Perforated Zinc, six pairs to the set (Fig. +71) 7/0 pair.




Fig. 473. Gooche's Scored, 36 × 18 in. (Fig. 473) 5/o piece. Gutta Percha ... Poroplastic best quality




Fig. 524.			Fig. 525	•		Fig. 5	26.	•




Fig. 531. Right, 6/o.




Fig. 638. Fig. 639.





Fig. 643. Fig. 644.








Fig. 654.	Fig. 655.	Fig. 65	6.




Fig. 657. Fig. 659.

The object of this instrument is to render audible all sounds, whether natural or caused by morbid conditions, of the human body. They can be heard with much greater intensity and within much narrower limits than has hitherto been possible with the ordinary stethoscope. At the same time, it conveys with greater accuracy the nature of the sound. It is shaped like a large watch, the front part being composed of two discs, one lying above the other. 



Apparatus for Sterilizing Instruments—

Various methods have been tried to disinfect instruments by means of hot air ovens, steam sterilizers, or strong antiseptic solutions, but none of them have proved satisfactory.


Instruments exposed to steam most invariably rust, causing much annoyance and no little expense for subsequent repairs. Hot air currents are injurious to the temper of steel and dull the edges of cutting instruments, while the method of simply immersing instruments in an antiseptic solution should not be countenanced, as it is not at all reliable.

Bacteriological experiments have proved beyond question that micro-organisms of ordinary pus and green pus are destroyed by boiling water within a few seconds, and germs of anthrax within a few minutes. By immersing instruments in boiling water from one to three minutes a thorough sterilization is accomplished.

One per cent. of soda should always be added to the water, as it will prevent the steel from rusting and keep the instruments brightly polished. Cutting instruments should not be left in the boiling soda solution more than one minute, as the edges are apt to be dulled when boiled too long.

Knives treated with due care in this way can be sterilized three or four times before they need resharpening.

The boiling of metal surgical instruments in a one per cent. soda solution cannot be too strongly recommended as the most economical and effectual method.





This apparatus is the most suitable for use in hospitals, being very compact, simple in construction, and safe in usage. By means of a very powerful Bunsen burner, consuming but very little gas, steam is generated in about five minutes, and a thorough, absolutely reliable sterilization is promptly effected by steam of about 105° Centigrade penetrating the material from above. The annoyance of escaping steam is entirely obviated, and the condensation takes place without wetting the material. For this reason the apparatus can be placed in the operating room, and thus be under immediate control and personal supervision of the surgeon. The time required for sterilization is onehalf hour, after which dressings may be taken out ready for use, not requiring any further drying. For wearing apparel, towels, etc., a wicker basket may be used to advantage. For surgical dressings we supply the so-called Schimmelbusch kettles, as illustrated by Fig. 788. 


Fig. 825. Fig. 826. Fig. 828. Fig. 829.


(Fig. 853) £5 5 0 irrigating, arranged




Fig. 4. 16×12 16×14 16×16 inches. $\frac{5/3}{5/6}$ $\frac{5/6}{6/3}$ $\frac{6/6}{7/3}$ each.




Fig. 9. Sizes 16×12 Drab Cloth, Fig. 9 or 10 6/0 Persian ,, ... 6/6






Fig. 5. India Rubber, Best Black (Fig. 5).




Fig. 4. Fig. 28.





Fig. 3. 5/o each. For Ladies or Children (Fig. 3)

The above is a combination of a hermetically closed India Rubber Reservoir (to contain the injection to be used) and Enema. Standard Boiling Burners-New Series. Registered.




(Fig. 2), Brass Pillar, on Mahogany Stand and Drawer, without Weights. 22/6 each.




